

Why become a Freeman?

'It's an honour' - Those who are Enrolled Freemen tell us that it is an honour, and it links them to their past and their family's heritage.

Today as a Freeman you can also get involved with the Pastures Committee, who take decisions on behalf of the Freemen - decisions about the land and property that the Freemen manage, Freeman Street market -now 150 years old, or activities within our community.

The dividend known as a moiety payment - In times gone by Enrolled Freemen have received a dividend known as a moiety payment twice per year, in recent years this hasn't been the case; we will not be providing a dividend again this coming year. However, we have a determined board, and with the recent changes that have been made, finances are improving. We hope that in the not-too-distant future we can reignite a moiety payment once again.

Too support the local community – As well as working towards supporting the Enrolled Freemen, the Freemen are also passionate about supporting the community, particularly through Freeman Street Market, you could get involved and support those activities too.

Heritage – in the future we want to conserve the Freemans Heritage, we have lots of documents, that we need support to log and archive. In time we hope to get some funding to help us do this, if you love your local history, you can get involved.

Explore if you can become a Freeman and support the Pastures Committee to help us grow and flourish. If you do apply and are successful you will have the opportunity to take part in the historic Mayors Court in October, were you will be enrolled as a Freeman or Freewoman.



Remembrance Day

The event was well-attended, with both traders and customers showing their unwavering support, and we are proud to announce that a significant amount of money was raised for the Poppy Appeal, further demonstrating our community's commitment to honoring and supporting our veterans. 
